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Safeguarding Investigation

Changes to the way services are delivered have meant that there is now a number of staff for whom Joint Investigations will become part of their working practice.

As a minimum requirement all staff attending this course will have previously undertaken training in Safeguarding Awareness for Adults or Children.

The course will follow the ABE guidelines (as laid out under the 1999 Youth Justice and Criminal Act)

Aim

To improve the approach to joint investigations with the police and other associated agencies

To gain a clearer understanding of the roles and responsibilities for self and other partners in conducting joint investigations

To develop and improve knowledge and appreciation of interviewing skills and techniques for vulnerable and intimidated witnesses

To define the requirements and techniques for evidence preservation

To be clear of the requirements in facilitating Vulnerable Adults and children interviewing

To have a greater understanding of how to support post police investigation

To update and develop knowledge and understanding of the legal framework around lack of capacity issues and criminal proceedings

To raise awareness and appreciation of the links between domestic violence and adult / child protection

It is envisaged that this can be a 1 or 2 day course which will engage the participants in a variety of interactive activities. There is a requirement that all participants will engage in some form of activity that will assess their learning in relation to the learning objectives.
